Week Three | A Burden Lifted. A Journey Begun

Scripture Reading:

Zechariah 3:1-5

Summary:

Having been equipped at the House of the Interpreter, Christian now comes to the cross.

He finally loses his burden. Despite this glorious experience of relief, Christian returns to

his journey and almost immediately reaches to the Hill of Difficulty.

Christian gives his full effort to making the climb. He finally reaches an arbor where he

stops to rest, but this turns into indulgent deep sleep. After being awoken with a fright, he

resumes his journey but forgets his scroll at the arbor. Thankfully, he is able to retrace his

steps and find the scroll. Finally, he arrives at the House Beautiful.
